Board of Governors Meeting


- The Special Fund is currently \$283,156.03
- There was nobody prepared to make a presentation on the 2026 International Convention, which will be held in Calgary, Alberta, Canada on July 19th – 25th, 2026. As of July 12th, the host hotel is booked up and people are being directed to overflow hotels.
- The 2027 International Convention will be held in Waidring, Austria on Jun 13th – 20th, 2027, and hosted by Germany XXI. This is the same location as the 2014 International Convention.

General Membership Meeting

- International Webmaster requests that chapters clean out their corporate email boxes on a regular basis. Members can add a custom password to their members only login in the Member Update section of the website. If you receive a notice that your password is expired, it is spam. BK International will not send a link for that. Chapters should check their links on the international website to make sure that it is correct for contact for their chapter.



The proposal was ratified.

- Treasurer advised that we finished FY 2025 \$25,619.00 in the black.
- VP NA advised that we currently have 14,446 members in 576 chapters.
- Election Committee provided the results of the International Executive Committee Elections: **President- Russ Harper** 1559, Jim Trachta 1508, John Bull 937; **NAVP- Cal Ennals** 1772, Jerry Zollo 1022; **EUVP- Leonie Tormans** 703, Tom Elliott 531; **Secretary- Glen Wheat** 3897; **Treasurer- Brian Arnold** 3890
- **Proposal 2024-0006** to change the Honorary Membership numbers to 8 for the first one and then one for every 10 members from 20 on. The proposal was ratified.
- **Proposal 2025-0003** to implement an application form in order to run for the International Executive Committee. The proposal was ratified.
- **Proposal 20025-0006** to change the qualifications for an Associate Member to no longer require them to receive monetary compensation.

The next General Membership Meeting will be held on July 20th, 2026, at 13:00 hours MDT in Calgary, Alberta, Canada. The deadline for agenda items is June 21st, 2026, at 16:00 hours EDT.

Board of Directors Meeting

- **Proposal 2025-0005** to establish guidelines for Chartering a new chapter. Passed with me voting in favor.

The next Board of Directors Meeting will be held on September 10th, 2025, at 11:00 hours ET and the deadline for agenda items is August 10th, 2025, at 16:00 hours ET.


LANE SPLITTING AND LANE FILTERING

On July 1st, 2025, Minnesota became the first state in the MWRC Conference to pass laws allowing Lane Splitting and Lane Filtering.

What is the difference between the Lane Splitting or Filtering?

- **Lane Splitting**: This involves a motorcyclist riding between lanes of traffic that are moving in the same direction. It's typically done in slow-moving or stopped traffic, such as in traffic jams.
- **Lane Filtering**: Lane filtering occurs when a motorcyclist moves between lanes of traffic at intersections, usually when vehicles are stopped at traffic lights. This allows the motorcyclist to reach the front of traffic and proceed quickly when the light changes.

Minnesota state statute 169.974 subd 5g says splitting and filtering can be done at under 25 MPH in moving traffic and under 15 MPH in stopped traffic. It's also prohibited in turn lanes, roundabouts and on ramps. Splitting and Filtering is your choice to do it or not. Before you decide to partake, familiarize yourself with the different MC laws as they differ state to state.



Iowa I, Iowa III and Iowa VI will be hosting the Spring 2026 Meeting in Oskaloosa, Iowa. The dates are June 12th through the 14th, 2026.

The host hotel will be the Fairfield Inn in Oskaloosa, Iowa. Room rate is \$110.00 per night and includes breakfast. We have a room block at the host hotel. If that fills up, there is another hotel across the main drag (about two blocks riding) that will price match the host hotel, and also offers free breakfast.



Of course, there will be a hospitality room with free beer and pop (soda, for those further south). STANDING RULES FOR THE MWRC



1. Carrying firearms at MWRC events after consuming alcoholic beverages is prohibited. Event hosts are required to provide secure storage for firearms if requested by any attendee.

2. All members are entitled to make motions and participate in discussions during Conference meetings. However, only the President (or Regular Member appointed by the President) of each MWRC Chapter in good standing will be allowed to vote on items of business and candidates for office at Conference meetings. Any Chapter which has not paid its annual dues shall not be considered in good standing.



3. MWRC officers shall consist of the Chairman, Vice-Chairman, Secretary / Treasurer, and International Representative. The officers shall serve two (2) year terms and shall be elected at the Fall Conference meeting during even numbered years. Candidates must declare (in writing) the office they seek to the MWRC Secretary / Treasurer prior to the adjournment of the Spring meeting of the election year. No later than August 1st of the election year the MWRC Secretary / Treasurer will provide the President of each MWRC Chapter with a list of the candidates for each office. This is meant to allow the Chapter President to confer with his membership prior to the voting.



4. Each Chapter in the MWRC shall pay annual dues to the Conference in the amount of \$1.00 (US) per chapter member, up to a maximum of \$25.00 (US) per year.



5. Bids to host MWRC conferences may be accepted up to two (2) years in advance.

6. All participants in parades or group rides, at any Blue Knights® Midwest Regional Conference event, must wear an approved motorcycle helmet.



7. The MWRC board will notify any active chapter within 50 miles prior to authorizing a charter to any new chapter, however final determination and approval will reside with the board
